Information on a Cumulative Thesis

Please note that the thesis must be published after the successful disputation. This is done by the University Library of Freie Universität to which the thesis has to be submitted. This is the prerequisite for receiving the certificate and thus to carry the title.

The thesis is excepted as it was examined by the reviewers. Therefore, it is required that the thesis published by the university is identical to the one submitted to the doctoral office for examination. In particular, DOI links for publication may only be used in the version send to the university library if the version examined by the reviewers of the thesis is content wise identical to the published version referred to by the DOI. Inserting a DOI link to an article that was altered after submission of the thesis is prohibited.

Please keep in mind that publications that have not yet been accepted often have to be revised and thus the published version differs from the submitted one. As stated above, you have to publish the version that is included in the examined thesis. You should therefore clarify in advance whether the license agreement with the publisher allows for that.

We recommend that all doctoral candidates reserve a simple right of use for publication on the university document server when individual papers are published by commercial publishers. This can be done, for example, by including the following clause in the author's contract: "The University Library of Freie Universität Berlin has the right to make the article freely available to the public via the document server or other form as of the date of its publication (alternatively 3 or 6 months after the article's publication date). Most major academic publishers now grant such a right of secondary publication on a document server; See also the SHERPA/RoMEO list http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/.

In case an electronic version is submitted to the university library for publication, DOI links of the articles may be substitute the publication (for requirements s.a.). Please note that the two hardcopies, that have to be submitted to the university library, have to contain the full text of the publications - with details of the original place of publication. If you do not receive a simple right of use for a second publication on the document server from the publisher, you can apply for an embargo of 12 months. This means that the publications remain inaccessible to the public and will only be released after the embargo has expired.
